



Road Closure Times Saturday 22 February



About our Event

The 2026 East Riding Stages Rally will start from Beverley North Bar Within on Saturday 21 February, and continue for a second day of competition from the FanZone in Saturday Market on Sunday 22 February.

This year's rally brings a completely new route, with the opening leg starting with a new version of the iconic Westwood stage, alongside the all-new Little Wold and Great Wold stages. For the first time, spectators will have the exciting spectacle of rallying in the dark.

On Sunday morning, the action restarts from the Saturday Market FanZone and includes four revised stages – Seaton, Rise, Ellerby and Swine. A second visit to the Westwood is followed by a repeat of the morning stages, before the finish ceremony in Saturday Market. The rally is authorised by the governing body of motorsport in the UK and has been planned in close conjunction with the local councils, emergency services, local residents and East Yorkshire County Council.

Some roads will be closed during the Rally and we appreciate that this can have an impact on residents. The good news is that, with the exception of the Westwood, each road will only be closed for one day.

The organisers, Beverley & District Motor Club, and our competitors, are very grateful to the residents of Beverley and the East Riding, and we hope that you enjoy the spectacle of this closed road rally.
